The Greater Memphis Economic Research Group takes an active approach to monitor economic trends and conditions impacting the Greater Memphis region. On November 19th, 2024, new jobs data for October 2024 was released for metropolitan areas nationwide. Relative to this release, we highlight the updated progress of regional job growth and trends.

Market Update

Job Growth

National job growth was flat for October 2024, with an increase of less than 0.01%. The Greater Memphis region experienced an increase in seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll (job) estimates of approximately 0.4%. This increase in job figures resulted in an unemployment rate of 4.3% for October, which is 0.2% higher than the national unemployment rate of 4.1%.

Between September 2024 and October 2024, local seasonally adjusted estimates increased by 2,500 jobs, an improvement following significant losses in 02 2024.

The Greater Memphis region's local employment estimate for October 2024 is **656,600 jobs**, which is above pre-pandemic highs.


The October 2024 estimates indicate that the market is currently above the pre-pandemic record set in 2020 by 300 jobs (+0.04%).

As highlighted on the following page, regional growth remains on course compared to major metropolitan areas of similar size and composition. Additionally, industry sector growth is emphasized, illustrating progress in key segments of the regional economy.

Oct. 2023 through Oct. 2024 Seasonally Adjusted






Job growth across peer metro areas slowed through 2023 and into 2024, in comparison to the swift recovery of 2022.

Of these four peer cities, all but Louisville experienced job increases in October 2024.

Employment in the state of Tennessee increased by 2,600 jobs (0.1%) in October 2024.

Year-over-year, Tennessee gained 45,200 jobs (+1.4%) compared to October 2023, according to the October 2024 data release.

Employment changes mostly positive across industries in October. The Education & Health sector grew another 1.30% in October, followed by a rally in the Leisure & Hospitality sector (0.90%), easing into the holiday season. In contrast, Financial Activities declined by 0.63%. Year-over-year, Education & Health continues to thrive with 7.56% growth, while Government declined by 1.85% compared to last year. Also of note, Other Services (which is inclusive of personal services and maintenance like haircuts, oil changes, etc.) has grown since 2023, signaling returning consumer confidence and increases in discretionary spending within regional households.

NOTE: The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Current Employment Statistics (CES) program have revised employment data to reflect the incorporation of the latest benchmarks and the recalculation of seasonal adjustment factors. This process affects not seasonally adjusted data from April 2022 to December 2023 and seasonally adjusted data from January 2019 to December 2023. This will impact our figures moving forward in 2024 by providing a more accurate and up-to-date baseline for employment trends. Job Market Demand

In October 2024, 29,366 jobs were posted in the Memphis MSA. Of these, only 12,205 (42%) were determined to be unique and not duplicative of another live posting. This is an increase of 16.5% versus September 2024's 10,476 unique postings.

The current unemployment rate of 4.3% produces a total of 26,980 unemployed persons available for work. There are 2.21 employees available per unique job post.

Among the 12,205 unique job postings, only 4,993 (41%) advertised salary information. The median salary of these posts is \$25.32 per hour. This represents a decrease in median advertised wages of -\$0.10 per hour as compared to September 2024's median of \$25.42.

As compared to October 2023, there are 468 fewer (-3.6%) unique job postings in October 2024. However, median advertised wages in October 2024 are \$3.69 higher (17%) than median advertised wages in October of 2023.
